A. Background of the book:

- 1. Written by the Apostle John around 88-90. John Zebedee, the brother of James
- 2. The second of three General Epistles written by the Apostle John, after his account of the Gospel; and before his fifth book: Revelation.
- 3. Written to "the elect lady and her children" vs. "my little children" in 1 John.
- 4. This book has one chapter, containing 13 verses comprised of 298 words. Average word length = five letters.
- 5. Parallel chapter in Isaiah = Chapter 63.
