Period 3.c. Jovinianism

- 2. Essential Theory, Belief, or Practice:
 - 1. Water Baptism is an outward symbol of the inner transformation wrought through faith.
 - 2. He repudiated the idea that starvation conduces to holiness.
 - 3. Christ dwells in all equally, without any difference or degrees, and no difference in rewards.
 - 4. Believers are a temple of God, not temples.
 - 5. Two classes of people –saved and unsaved.
 - 6. Salvation is by grace and not of merit, and those that are saved are saved absolutely.
 - 7. Denied the perpetual virginity of Mary

Period 3.c. Jovinianism

- 3. Principle Character:
- Jovinianus Romanus d. 406
- Condemned as a heretic in 390 by a Roman synod
- A Milanese synod under Ambrose excommunicated Jovanianists
- His followers took refuge in the Alpine valleys and kept alive his evangelical teachings.
- These reappeared in the 12c. With Arnoldists, Petrobusians and Henricians
