

- 1. Principle Character:
- Martin Luther (1483-1547)
- Son of a Saxon Peasant Miner
- Educated at Erfurt 1501 Ba 1502, Ma 1505
- Assumed Augustinian monastic vows 1505
- Posted his 95 Theses October 31, 1517 on the Wittenberg Church door
- Excommunicated by Pope Leo X
- Great influence on William Tyndale

- 3. Essential Theory, Belief, or Practice:
- Indulgences the forgiving of punishment by purchase of special prayers, pilgrimages, etc. (95 Theses)
- Justification by Faith Alone (Aug. Article 4)
- Baptism Necessary for Salvation (Aug. Article 9) Condemns Anabaptists
- The Lord's Supper The Body and Blood of Jesus Christ are truly present in the form of Bread and Wine (Aug. Article 10)
- Confession of Sins Should be done in private with a Pastor (Aug. Article 11)
- Repentance 1. Contrition, 2. Faith, 3. Good Works (Aug. Article
- Priests may Marry (Aug. Article 23)

4. Scriptural Refutation:

- Salvation at this time is by the Faith of Christ, not my faith in Him Rom. 3:19-26, Gal.2:16, Ph.3:9
- Salvation is by Grace Alone Eph. 2:8-10
- Salvation is Sealed at this time, and not dependent on my ability to "stay saved". Eph. 4:30, 2 Tim. 2: 13
