2. Essential Theory, Belief or Practice:

Arminianism – 5 Points (contrast with Calvinism)

- Partial Depravity Humanity is depraved but still able to seek God
- 2. Conditional Election God only chooses those he knows will believe
- 3. Unlimited Atonement Jesus died for everyone
- 4. Resistible Grace God's call to be saved can be resisted
- 5. Conditional Salvation Christians can lose their salvation
- Christian Perfectionism
