

- Study to shew thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth. 2 Timothy 2:15


- 2. Essential Theory, Belief or Practice:
- 1. That there are seven distinguishable economies in God's redemptive purpose (Dispensationalism).
 - 1. Paradise 2.Noah 3. Abraham 4. Israel 5. Gentiles 6. the Spirit 7. the Millennium
- 2. There is a distinction between Israel and the Church. 1 Cor. 10:32
- 3. That Christ's second coming will occur prior to His Millennial Kingdom 1 Th. 4:13-18, Rev. 20:1-7(Premillennialism).
- 4. That Daniel's 70th Week has yet to be fulfilled Dan.9:20-23 (Futurism).
- 5. That the notion of a clergyman was a sin against the holy Spirit ye are brethren (Matt. 23:8).

3. Principle Character:

John Nelson Darby (Nov 1800-Apr 1882)

- Westminster School, London & Trinity College, Dublin. Studied law, then became an Anglican Priest
- Pastored for 2 years in Dublin, Ireland
- 1827 Formed the Plymouth Brethren
- Father of Modern Dispensationalism
 & Futurism
- Pioneered the teaching of the Rapture (1 Th. 3:14-18)





4. Scriptural Refutation:
