to them who are the called according to his purpose. (9:11, Eph. 1:9, 2 Tim. 1:9

29 For whom he did foreknow, (11:2, Ac. 2:23, 1 Pe. 1:2)

he also did predestinate to be conformed to the image of his Son, (Rom. 8:30, Eph. 1:5, 11) that he might be the firstborn among many brethren.

Unique Word - #111 Predestinate

#111 Predestinate. This word appears twice in the present tense, and twice in the past tense in the KJB.

• Rom. 8:29 "For whom he did foreknow, he also did predestinate to be conformed to the

image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brethren."

- Rom. 8:30 "Moreover whom he did predestinate, them he also called: and whom he called, them he also justified: and whom he justified, them he also glorified."
- Eph. 1:5 "Having predestinated us unto the adoption of children by Jesus Christ to himself, according to the good pleasure of his will,"
- Eph. 1:11 "In whom also we have obtained an inheritance, being predestinated according to the purpose of him who worketh all things after the counsel of his own will:"

Unique Word - #111 Predestinate

- The word first appeared with TYN in the 1526 edition of the NT at Eph. 1:11 only. Subsequently, COV and MAT used predestinate in the same place. GEN expanded on its use in Eph.1:5 and also in Rom.8:29-30.
- The Oxford Dictionary of Etymology has the verb form first appearing with WYC in the fourteenth century. That cannot be confirmed here in the reference texts. See Table 111 below.

Unique Word - #111 Predestinate

- SOED—predestinate /Opri: destinat/ adjective and noun. LME. [ORIGIN Ecclesiastical Latin praedestinatus pa. pple of praedestinare: see predestinate verb, -ate².] ► A adjective. 1 Theology. Foreordained by divine purpose or decree (to a specified fate, to do); spec. predestined for salvation or eternal life. LME. 2 gen. Predestined, fated. E16. ► B noun. Theology. A person predestined for eternal life; one of God's elect. E16. predestinately adverb by predestination L16.
- Strong's Greek Dictionary 4309. $\pi\rhooo\rho\iota\zeta\omega$ proorizo pro-or-id'-zo from 4253 and 3724; to limit in advance, i.e. (figuratively) predetermine: —determine before, ordain, predestinate. The GK $\pi\rhooo\rho\iota\zeta\omega$ appears seven times in the TR and is translated as predestinate or predestinated as shown in Table 111 above. It is also translated as determined before in Acts4:28; he in Rom.8:29; and as ordained in 1 Cor. 2:7. JW.

Unique Word- #29 Conformable

#29 Conformable. This word appears in two different forms in the KJB. Once as conformable, and twice as conformed.

- Phil. 3:10 "That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death;"
- Rom. 8:29 "For whom he did foreknow, he also did predestinate to be conformed to the image of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brethren."
- Rom. 12:2 "And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God."
- Conformable originated with TYN and all the prescribed reference texts follow suit. Note that conformed in Rom.12:2 above is given in opposition to transformed (#166), another unique word in the same verse. Conformable used in Rom.8:29, originated with the Rheims NT. See Appendix Table C for a complete list of words selected by the KJB translators from the Rheims NT. Whereas the earliest known use of the word was in the fourteenth century with WYC at Rom. 12:2. See Table 29 below.

Unique Word- #29 Conformable

- Strong's Greek Dictionary 4964. $\sigma u \sigma \chi \eta \mu \alpha \tau i \zeta \omega$ suschematizo soos-khay-mat-id'-zo from 4862 and a derivative of 4976; to fashion alike, i.e. conform to the same pattern (figuratively): —conform to, fashion self according to. The $Gk \sigma u \sigma \chi \eta \mu \alpha \tau i \zeta \omega$ appears three times in the TR and translated be and conformed at Rom. 12:2, and as fashioning yourselves according to at 1 Pet. 1:14 in the KJB. JW.

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
