19 Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another. 20 For meat destroy not the work of God. All things indeed *are* pure; but *it is* evil for that man who eateth with offence. 21 *It is* good neither to eat flesh, nor to drink wine, nor *any thing* whereby thy brother stumbleth, or is offended, or is made weak. 22 Hast thou faith? have *it* to thyself before God. Happy *is* he that condemneth not himself in that thing which he alloweth. 23 And he that doubteth is damned if he eat, because *he eateth* not of faith: for whatsoever *is* not of faith is sin. Verse 19:

19 Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, (Ps. 34:14, 2 Tim 2:22, Heb 12:14)

and things wherewith one may edify another. (1Cor 14:3, Eph 4:29, 1 Th 5:11). *See next slide*.

23 Unique Word - Edify

Edify There are multiple forms of the unique word edify found in the KJB: Edification, Edified, Edifieth, Edify, and Edifying. Due to the number of these word forms, I have assigned separate tables for them, in alphabetical order.

#41d Edify. The verb form appears three times in the text of the KJB and once in the margin at Eph.4:29.

- Rom. 14:19 "Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another."
- 1 Cor. 10:23 "All things are lawful for me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but all things edify not."
- Eph. 4:29 "Let no corrupt communication proceed out of your mouth, but that which is good to the use of edifying, that it may minister grace unto the hearers." Margin: Or, to edify profitably
- 1 Thess. 5:11 "Wherefore comfort yourselves together, and edify one another, even as also ye do."
