3 Romans Lesson 72 15:1-6

1 We then that are strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, and not to please ourselves. 2 Let every one of us please *his* neighbour for *his* good to edification. 3 For even Christ pleased not himself; but, as it is written, The reproaches of them that reproached thee fell on me. 4 For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope. 5 Now the God of patience and consolation grant you to be likeminded one toward another according to Christ Jesus: 6 That ye may with one mind *and* one mouth glorify God, even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Verses 1-2:

1 We then that are strong ought to bear the infirmities of the weak, (14:1, Gal 6:1, 1 Th 5:14) and not to please ourselves. (1 Cor 10:33)

2 Let every one of us please *his* neighbour (Php 2:4, Gal 1:10 1 Cor 9:19) for *his* good to edification. *UW*. (14:19)

5 Unique Word - Edification

41a Edification. This word form appears four times in the KJB.

Rom. 15:2 "Let every one of us please *his* neighbour for *his* good to edification."

1 Cor. 14:3 "But he that prophesieth speaketh unto men *to* edification, and exhortation, and comfort."

2 Cor. 10:8 "For though I should boast somewhat more of our authority, which the Lord hath given us for edification, and not for your destruction, I should not be ashamed:"

2 Cor. 13:10 "Therefore I write these things being absent, lest being present I should use sharpness, according to the power which the Lord hath given me to edification, and not to destruction."

SOED-edification /0, ɛdɪfɪˈkeɪʃ(ə)n/ noun. LME. [ORIGIN Latin aedificatio (n-), from aedificat- pa. ppl stem of aedificare build: see edify, -ation.] 1 Building, construction. arch. LME. ▶ †b A building. LME–M17. 2 The building up of the church, or the soul, in faith and holiness; the imparting of moral and spiritual stability and strength by suitable instruction and exhortation. LME.

Strong's Greek Dictionary 3619. οικοδομη oikodome *oy-kod-om-ay'* feminine (abstract) of a compound of 3624 and the base of 1430; architecture, i.e. (concretely) a structure; figuratively, confirmation:—building, edify(-ication, -ing). *The Gk οικοδομη appears 18 times in the TR and translated as building or buildings six times, edification 4 times, as edifying 7 times, and as edify once in the KJB. JW.*

Verses 3-4:

3 For even Christ pleased not himself; (Jn 5:30, Php 2:5-9) but, as it is written, (Ps 69:9)

The reproaches of them that reproached thee fell on me.

4 For whatsoever things were written aforetime (Ps 102:18)
were written for our learning, (2 Tim 3:15-16, Rom 12:7)
that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope. (Ps 119:50)

Verses 5-6:

5 Now the God of patience (v.4, Rom 5:3-4)
and consolation (2 Th 2:16)
grant you to be likeminded one toward another according to Christ Jesus: (Rom 12:16)

6 That ye may with one mind *and* one mouth glorify God, (2 Co 13:11, Php 1:27)
even the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. (2 Co 1:3, Eph 1:3, Col 1:3, 1 Pe 1:3)
