#### 37 Romans Lesson 82 16:21-24

Verses 21-22:

21 Timotheus (Ac 16:1-3, 17:14-15, 1 Tim 4:14, 2 Tim 1:2,5) my workfellow, (*UW-see next slide*) and Lucius, (Ac 13:1) and Jason, (Ac 17:5-9. One who will heal) and Sosipater, (Ac 20:4. Saviour of his father) my kinsmen, salute you.

22 I Tertius, (Only mention. *Third*) who wrote *this* epistle, salute you in the Lord.

# 38 Unique Word - Workfellow

#198 Workfellow. This word appears once in the KJB.

Rom 16:21 "Timotheus my workfellow, and Lucius, and Jason, and Sosipater, my kinsmen, salute you."

Workfellow first appeared as two words in 1526 with TYN. It became one word in BIS (1568 and 1602). The first subject of the verse is Timothy and identified as Paul's workfellow. At Phil. 2:20, the relationship between Paul and Timotheus had been defined as being likeminded:

"For I have no man likeminded, who will naturally care for your state."

#### 40 Romans Lesson 82 16:21-24

Verses 23-24:

23 Gaius mine host, (1 Cor 1:14, Ac 19:29, 20:4, 3 Jn 1. *Lord*) and of the whole church, (3x. Ac 15:22,1 Cor 14:23) saluteth you.

Erastus the chamberlain of the city saluteth you, (Ac 19:22, 2 Tim 4:20. *Beloved*) and Quartus a brother. (Only mention. *fourth*)

24 The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all. Amen.
