Verse 11:

Margin: Or, *liberality*. Gr. *Simplicity*. See V.13

Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, *let him do it* with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy, with cheerfulness. Romans 12:8

Verse 12:

12 For the administration of this service not only supplieth the want of the saints, (8:14) but is abundant also by many thanksgivings unto God;

20 **Unique Word #4 Administration**

• #4 Administration – the singular form appears once, as does the plural in the KJB:

For the administration of this service not only supplieth the want of the saints, but is abundant also by many thanksgivings unto God; 2 Cor. 9:12

And there are differences of administrations, but the same Lord. 1 Cor. 12:5

• The word first used by William Tyndale in his 1526 NT and the subsequent prescribed reference texts (with the exception of Coverdale, 1537).

21 **Unique Word #4 Administration**

1 And in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplied, there arose a murmuring of the Grecians against the Hebrews, because their widows were neglected in the daily ministration.

2 Then the twelve called the multitude of the disciples *unto them*, and said, It is not reason that we should leave the word of God, and serve tables.

3 Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business. Acts 6:1-3

22 **Unique Word #4 Administration**

• SOED - administration /0ədmɪnɪ'strɛɪʃ(ə)n/ noun. ME. [ORIGIN Old French & Modern French, or Latin administratio(n-), formed as administrate: see -ation.] 1 The action of administering something to another. ME. 2 The action of administering in any office; attendance; performance (of). obsolete in gen. sense. LME.

• Strong's Greek dictionary 1248. διακονία diakonía, *dee-ak-on-ee'-ah* from 1249; attendance (as a

servant, etc.); figuratively (eleemosynary) aid, (official) service (especially of the Christian teacher, or technically of the diaconate):—(ad-)minister(-ing, -tration, -try), office, relief, service(-ing). *Feminine noun.* The Gk διακονία appears in 32 verses, for a total of 36 times in the TR and appears once as of administrations at 1 Cor. 12:5; and once as the administration at 2 Cor. 9:12. JW.

Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality. Romans 12:13

24 Unique Word #48: Experiment

SOED-experiment /0ɪk'spɛrɪmənt, ɛk-/ verb. LME. [ORIGIN from the noun.] +1 verb trans. = experience verb 4. LME–E18. †2 verb trans. Ascertain or establish by trial. L15–E19. 3 verb trans. Make trial or experiment of; test, try. Now rare. E16.

How the Greek word *dokime* is translated in other places:

Ro 5:4 And patience, experience; and experience, hope:

2 Co 2:9 For to this end also did I write, that I might know the proof of you, whether ye be obedient in all things.

2 Co 8:2 How that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded unto the riches of their liberality. 2 Co 13:3 Since ye seek a proof of Christ speaking in me, which to you-ward is not weak, but is mighty in you.

Php 2:22 But ye know the proof of him, that, as a son with the father, he hath served with me in the gospel.
