	From Page 1 of An Admonition to the Christian Reader (1618): As for the books of the New Testament, which are contained in the Bible, although some particular Doctors, though without reason, have doubted, whether the epistle to the Hebrews, the epistle of James, the second of Peter, the second and third of John, the epistle of Jude, and the Revelation of John, were to be held for Canonical or no: yet notwithstanding the Primitive Church generally have never doubted of it, neither are they in our time questioned, but are by all Christendom esteemed and held to be divine and Canonical books.
