11 Speak not evil one of another, brethren. (1 Pe 2:1, 3:16)

He that speaketh evil of his brother,

and judgeth his brother, (2:4, Mt 7:1, Lk 6:37, Ro 14:13)

speaketh evil of the law, and judgeth the law:

but if thou judge the law, thou art not a doer of the law, but a judge. [Contrast with 1 Co 6:2]

Speak not evil:

- 1 Peter 2:1 "Wherefore laying aside all malice, and all quile, and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings,"
- 1 Peter 3:16 "Having a good conscience; that, whereas they speak evil of you, as of evildoers, they may be ashamed that falsely accuse your good conversation in Christ."
- Ephesians 4:31 "Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger, and clamour, and evil speaking, be put away from you, with all malice:"
- Acts 23:5 "Then said Paul, I wist not, brethren, that he was the high priest: for it is written, Thou shalt not speak evil of the ruler of thy people."
- Titus 3:2 "To speak evil of no man, to be no brawlers, but gentle, shewing all meekness unto all men."

Judgeth his brother:

- James 2:4 "Are ye not then partial in yourselves, and are become judges of evil thoughts?"
- Matthew 7:1 "Judge not, that ye be not judged." Luke 6:37 "Judge not, and ye shall not be judged: condemn not, and ye shall not be condemned: forgive, and ye shall be forgiven:"
- Romans 14:13 "Let us not therefore judge one another any more: but judge this rather, that no man put a stumblingblock or an occasion to fall in his brother's way."

One lawgiver:

- Isaiah 33:22 "For the LORD is our judge, the LORD is our lawgiver, the LORD is our king; he will save us."
- Psalm 108:8 "Gilead is mine; Manasseh is mine; Ephraim also is the strength of mine head; Judah is my lawgiver;"
- Hebrews 7:14 "For it is evident that our Lord sprang out of Juda; of which tribe Moses spake nothing concerning priesthood."

Who art thou:

- Genesis 27:18 "And he came unto his father, and said, My father: and he said, Here am I; who art thou, my son?"
- John 1:19 "And this is the record of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, Who art thou?"

Judgest another:

Romans 14:4 "Who art thou that judgest another man's servant? to his own master he standeth or falleth. Yea, he shall be holden up: for God is able to make him stand."

For what is your life? (De 32:47,Lk 12:22, Col 3:3)

It is even a vapour, (Job 7:7) that appeareth for a little time, and then vanisheth away.

Psalm 90:10 "The days of our years *are* threescore years and ten; and if by reason of strength *they be* fourscore years, yet *is* their strength labour and sorrow; for it is soon cut off, and we fly away."

The morrow:

- Proverbs 27:1 "Boast not thyself of to morrow; for thou knowest not what a day may bring forth."
- Luke 12:18 "And he said, This will I do: I will pull down my barns, and build greater; and there will I bestow all my fruits and my goods. 19 And I will say to my soul, Soul, thou hast much goods laid up for many years; take thine ease, eat, drink, and be merry. 20 But God said unto him, Thou fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be, which thou hast provided?"

What is your life?

- Deuteronomy 32:47 "For it is not a vain thing for you; because it is your life: and through this thing ye shall prolong your days in the land, whither ye go over Jordan to possess it."
- Luke 12:22 "And he said unto his disciples, Therefore I say unto you, Take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat; neither for the body, what ye shall put on."

What did our Apostle tell us about your life?

Colossians 3:3 "For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God."
