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4 Miles Coverdale (1488-1569)

- Born in Yorkshire, England
- Educated at Cambridge
- Priest at Norwich 1514
- Left for the Continent 1528
- Was not proficient in Hebrew and Greek (Coverdale Prologue)
- 1538 Wrote a Diglott (Parallel English & Latin Vulgate)
- His translation of the Psalter is used in the Book of Common Prayer

- 2 Thessalonians 3:[1] Pray for us, that the word of God may have free passage & be glorified.
- Colossians 3:[16] Let the word of Christ dwell in you plenteously in all wisdom. &c.

7 D The Coverdale Bible - 1535

- New Testament Title Page
- Coverdale separated the thirteen epistles of Paul from the Four Gospel accounts and the General Epistles
- The order of the books is different from the King James Bible

9 The Coverdale Bible – Year of Printing

- The colophon at the end of the Book of Revelation shows the year of printing 1535
- Finished on the fourth of October

• Printed in Antwerp by Merten de Keyser in Antwerp, Belgium

10 The Coverdale Bible - 1535

• Textual basis:

"I have neither wrested nor altered so much as one word for the maintenance of any manner of sect: but have with a clear conscience purely and faithfully translated this out of five sundry interpreters, having only the manifest truth of the scripture before mine eyes" (Dedication to the King, 1535 ed.)

• The Five are:

1. Tyndale's New Testament, The Book of Jonah, The Pentateuch up through 2 Chronicles 1526-1536

- 2. Pagnini's new Latin -1528
- 3. Luther's German Bible 1534
- 4. Zwingli's Zurich Bible of 1530
- 5. Jerome's Latin Vulgate late 4th C.

13 Subsequent Printings of the Coverdale Bible

- 1536
- 1537 by Nicolson (Queen Jane in the Dedication)
- 2 New Testament printings
- 20 others with the last in 1553
- It was reprinted in 1847 by Samuel Bagster & Sons, London
