- Edward VI came to the throne upon the death of Henry VIII & reigned for 6 years
- Lady Jane Grey succeeded Edward and reigned 11 days before being executed by Mary
- Mary Tudor came to the throne in 1553
- Her goal was to restore England to the Church of Rome.
- She had a lot of help from the Jesuits

15 John Rogers

- Returned to England in 1548
- First Protestant Martyr at the hand of Queen Mary February 4, 1555
