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# 3 D The Great Bible - Cromwell

- Born in Putney, Surrey
- Mercenary Soldier in Italy
- 1520 Member Mercantile
- 1523 Member of Parliament
- Chief Minister to Cardinal Wolsey
- Privy Seal for Henry and was beheaded 1540

## 4 🔲 The Great Bible – Cranmer

- First Archbishop to break with Rome
- Supported Henry VIII's divorce
- Book of Common Prayer under Edward VI
- Tried for Treason under Mary I
- Burned at the stake

## 5 🔲 The Great Bible – 1539-41

- Textual basis OT= Munster's new translation of the Latin 1535. NT = Received Text of Erasmus (1522) & the Complutensian Polyglot (1517)
- Significance No marginal notes allowed; Tyndale & Rogers Prologues were excluded. First Authorized English Bible by a monarch.
- Protagonists Cranmer, Cromwell, Coverdale (Editor)
- Antagonist Bishop Gardner & the French Government
