- Ezekiel 7:12 The time is come, the day draweth near: let not the buyer rejoice, nor the seller mourn: for wrath *is* upon all the multitude thereof.
- Revelation 14:15 And another angel came out of the temple, crying with a loud voice to him that sat on the cloud, Thrust in thy sickle, and reap: for the time is come for thee to reap; for the harvest of the earth is ripe.

Contrast with Paul:

• 2 Timothy 4:3 For the <u>time will come</u> when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears;

Verse 18:

And if the righteous scarcely be saved, (Matt 24:13)

where shall the ungodly and the sinner appear?

Answer: The White Throne Judgment, Revelation 20:11-12

11 And I saw a great white throne, and him that sat on it, from whose face the earth and the heaven fled away; and there was found no place for them. 12 And I saw the dead, small and great, stand before God; and the books were opened: and another book was opened, which is *the book* of life: and the dead were judged out of those things which were written in the books, according to their works.

9 1 Peter Lesson 20 Chapter 4:16-19

Verse 19:

Wherefore let them that suffer according to the will of God (4:2) commit the keeping of their souls *to him* in well doing, (Ps 31:5, Lk 23:46) as unto a faithful Creator.

- Psalm 31:5 Into thine hand I commit my spirit: thou hast redeemed me, O LORD God of truth.
- Luke 23:46 And when Jesus had cried with a loud voice, he said, Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit: and having said thus, he gave up the ghost.

Compare with Paul:

• 2 Timothy 1:12 For the which cause I also suffer these things: nevertheless I am not ashamed: for I know whom I have believed, and am persuaded that he is able to keep that which I have committed unto him against that day.
